Notes for Applicants' Consideration:

- · Kwewag Advisory Council (Women): will address issues related to traditional roles and responsibilities of Anishinaabekwe including but not limited to: language, culture, water (nibi), political governance, knowledge keepers, life giving, genealogy, and resource management.
- · Getzidjig Advisory Council (Elders): will address issues related to traditional roles and responsibilities of Anishinaabe Getzidjig including, but not limited to: spirituality, medicines, oral history, conflict resolution and advisors to all E'Debendaagzijig. Getzidjig pay a critical role in preserving and passing down Anishinaabe culture and traditions to future generations.
- · Eshki-Niigijig Advisory Council (Youth Ages 15-25): will address issues related to traditional roles and responsibilities of Anishinaabe Eshki-niigijig including but not limited to: learning, caretaking, visioning, and networking.
- · Niniwag Advisory Council (Men): Niniwag will address issues related to the traditional roles and responsibilities of Anishinaabe Niniwag including, but not limited to: fire (Shkode), harvesting, advocacy, protection, and teaching. The Niniwag Council will consider how to decolonize roles and responsibilities of Anishinaabe Niniwag.
- · Niizhwaadzhiwag Advisory Council (2SLGBQQIA+): will address issues related to the traditional roles and responsibilities of Anishinaabe Niizhwaadziwag including, but not limited to: mediation, spirituality, caretaking, health and well-being, and gender and sexuality advocacy. Niizhwaadzhiwag play a critical role in decolonizing Anishinaabe Aadziwin for an inclusive and traditional future.
- · Meeting Commitments: Nation Council Members may be asked to attend Regional Meetings, Grand Council Assemblies in June and November, quarterly Individual council meetings, monthly Nation Council and Commissioners meeting, work plan and strategic planning sessions. From time to time, other Anishinabek Nation programs may invite members to be on panels, forums, and summits.
- · Nation Council members receive honorariums for attending meetings and all expenses paid for attendance at meetings (meals, mileage, accommodation, incidentals).
- · Chiefs Veterans Committee will meet quarterly to improve the lives of Anishinabek Nation veterans and their families. The Committee works to better support and honour military veterans of past and current wars. Veterans not only includes those in military service, but is also dedicated to policing, and firefighting positions. The Committee brings forward the plight and highlights the struggles that veterans often face from homelessness, mental health, PTSD, unemployment to physical health as examples of impacts. The Committee's work centers on providing support and advocacy to improve the outcomes for those who served and continue to serve to protect our great Anishinabek Nation.
- · Expenses for meeting/travel/accommodations/honorariums are covered by the Anishinabek Nation for Chiefs Veterans Committee participation.
- · Nation Council members and the Chiefs Veterans Committee are supported by the Governance and Nation Council Coordination Team at the Anishinabek Nation.
- · Term of Appointment: November 2025 to November 2028.
- · The Anishinabek Nation will accept Expressions of Interest applications for consideration from July 2025 until September 30, 2025.
- · Expressions of Interest will be reviewed with the Regional Chiefs for appointment approvals.
